Wallpaper Hanging Instructions

Please read these instructions carefully before hanging this wallpaper. It is advisable that a professional decorator is used.

1 Inspect each roll

It is important to check each roll has the same batch number before cutting and hanging the wallpaper. Also check there is no variation in shade, and that no other faults are present. Please make sure there are enough rolls to complete the job. **Do not assume that the wallpaper will come off the roll the correct way up. Please see the image attached.** Examination of the paper before hanging is the buyer's responsibility. No claims can be considered after papers have been cut and hung, for defects which are apparent at the time of hanging. In the event of any complaint, please quote the product code and batch number on this label. Return any defective roll with its label to where it was purchased.

2 Preparation

- Remove any old wallpaper and loose paint and ensure that any holes or cracks are suitably filled and rubbed smooth when dry. Walls should be sound, clean and dry.
- We recommend painted surfaces are roughened with sandpaper to improve adhesion.
- Absorbant surfaces (such as new plaster) should be prepared with a primer/sealer.
- Metallic effects and foils can be damaged if high levels of alkaline are already present in the walls (such as newly plastered walls). Preparing the walls with an alkaline resistant primer neutralises the alkalinity of the surface.
- For best results, we recommend that the walls are cross-lined horizontally using a good quality lining paper. The lining paper should be allowed to dry completely before hanging the wallpaper.

3 Pasting

- Use a good quality, solvent-free, fungicide protected, light grade adhesive. Do not use self-mix adhesives; all-purpose and heavy-duty pastes are also not suitable.
- Apply an even coat of paste to the wallpaper, ensuring edges are fully pasted. Do not allow paste to come into contact with the surface.
- Once pasted fold the pasted surfaces together, top to middle and bottom to middle, and allow sufficient time for the paper to become supple (4-5 minutes). Care should be taken not to crease the paper when folding.

4 Hanging

- Hang wallpaper, smooth gently down the centre with a paperhangers brush, working out towards the edges, brushing out air bubbles as you go.
- Butt joins tightly but do not never overlap. Avoid squeezing paste out of joins and do not get paste on the brush, hands or seam roller.
- Paste may damage the surface of the wallpaper and cause surface printed colours to transfer. We cannot accept responsibility for marks or damage caused by paste.
- Any paste should be removed whilst still moist, by wiping gently across the entire surface using a clean, wet sponge.
- Trim top and bottom with a sharp knife or scissors.
- After hanging 2 or 3 lengths, inspect the result to ensure that no shading or other faults are present. No claims can be considered once more than one roll has been hung.

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Colouring the edges of hand printed wallpapers.

For use with Leaf Black/Gloss (JWP-205), Green/Gloss (JWP-206), Yellow/Gloss (JWP-207), Blue/Gloss (JWP-208); Scribble Turquoise/Gold (JWP-304), Silver/Grey (JWP-305)

Because of the nature of long table screen-printing, vacuum screen-printing and block printing, it is not possible to colour the edges of the wallpaper during manufacture. These three types of wallpaper are generally referred to as hand printed wallpapers.

For occasions where a coloured edge would be preferable i.e. where the wallpaper in question has a dark ground and has generally dark patterning along the edges, it is therefore advisable to colour the edges during the decoration process using a colour-matched water-soluble crayon or pencil. Water soluble crayons and pencils can be bought from the professional decorator shops and art shops. A suggested method of application is described below.

Unwrap the roll and carefully check it as you would in the normal manner, taking time to read the hanging instructions on the reverse of the label. Careful inspection of the roll is vital; as it cannot be returned once cut and/or coloured should there be a manufacturing fault.

After preparing the working area and taking the necessary measurements, cut the wallpaper to the desired length, again in the normal manner. Whilst the cut length is still dry, place it on the pasting table with its face up, aligning the edge of the paper so that it overhangs the edge of the table by one or two millimetres. Place your cutting ruler / straight edge carefully on top of the paper so that it aligns one or two millimetres short of and parallel to the edge.

Whilst gently holding the ruler in place with one hand, carefully run the wet and softened crayon/pencil along the cut edge of the wallpaper, angling the crayon/pencil slightly to minimise the possibility of getting crayon/pencil on the face of the paper. Repeat this process down the entire cut length and also down the opposite edge.

Should any crayon/pencil dust settle onto the face of the paper during the colouring process, gently remove it using a soft dry brush, making sure that the brush remains clean throughout. Blowing will also remove most crayon dust.

Paste, soak and hang the length in the usual manner. Being water-soluble, the crayon/pencil will soak into and stain the fibres of the paper along its edge. Should any crayon have remained on the surface of the paper, this can be removed by very gently sponging the face of the paper once hung, as you would to remove wallpaper paste.

Do not expect to achieve an absolute colour match using this method. Crayon colouring roll edges will however reduce the whiteness of the paper fibres, staining them to a colour that is in keeping with the colour of the wallpaper itself.

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Hang Leaf as a Half Drop. Repeat size is 100cm/39.4". Roll width is 52cm/20.5" and length is 10m/11yds.
